

Robert Brueggemann, the volume's editor, is an historian and critic of architecture, landscape, preservation, urban development, and the built environment. His books include the award-winning volume *The Architects and the City: Holabird & Roche of Chicago, 1880-1918*, the controversial *Sprawl: A Compact History*, and, most recently, *The Architecture of Harry Weese*.
