

The Pokagon Band of Potawatomi Indians has been a part of Chicago since its founding. *Imprints: The Pokagon Band of Potawatomi Indians and the City of Chicago* examines the ways some Pokagon Potawatomi tribal members have maintained a distinct Native identity, their rejection of assimilation into the mainstream, and their desire for inclusion in the larger contemporary society without forfeiting their “Indianness.” Mindful that contact is never a one-way street, Low also explores the ways in which experiences in Chicago have influenced the Pokagon Potawatomi.

Low will be interviewed by Jesse Dukes, Audio Producer for WBEZ Chicago, and author of the interactive feature, “Without Native Americans, Would we Have Chicago?” Following their conversation, Dr. Low will sign copies of the book. *Imprints* will be available in the Newberry Bookstore.

John N. Low (Pokagon Potawatomi) is Assistant Professor of Comparative Studies at the Ohio State University Newark and former Executive Director of the Mitchell Museum of the American Indian in Evanston.
